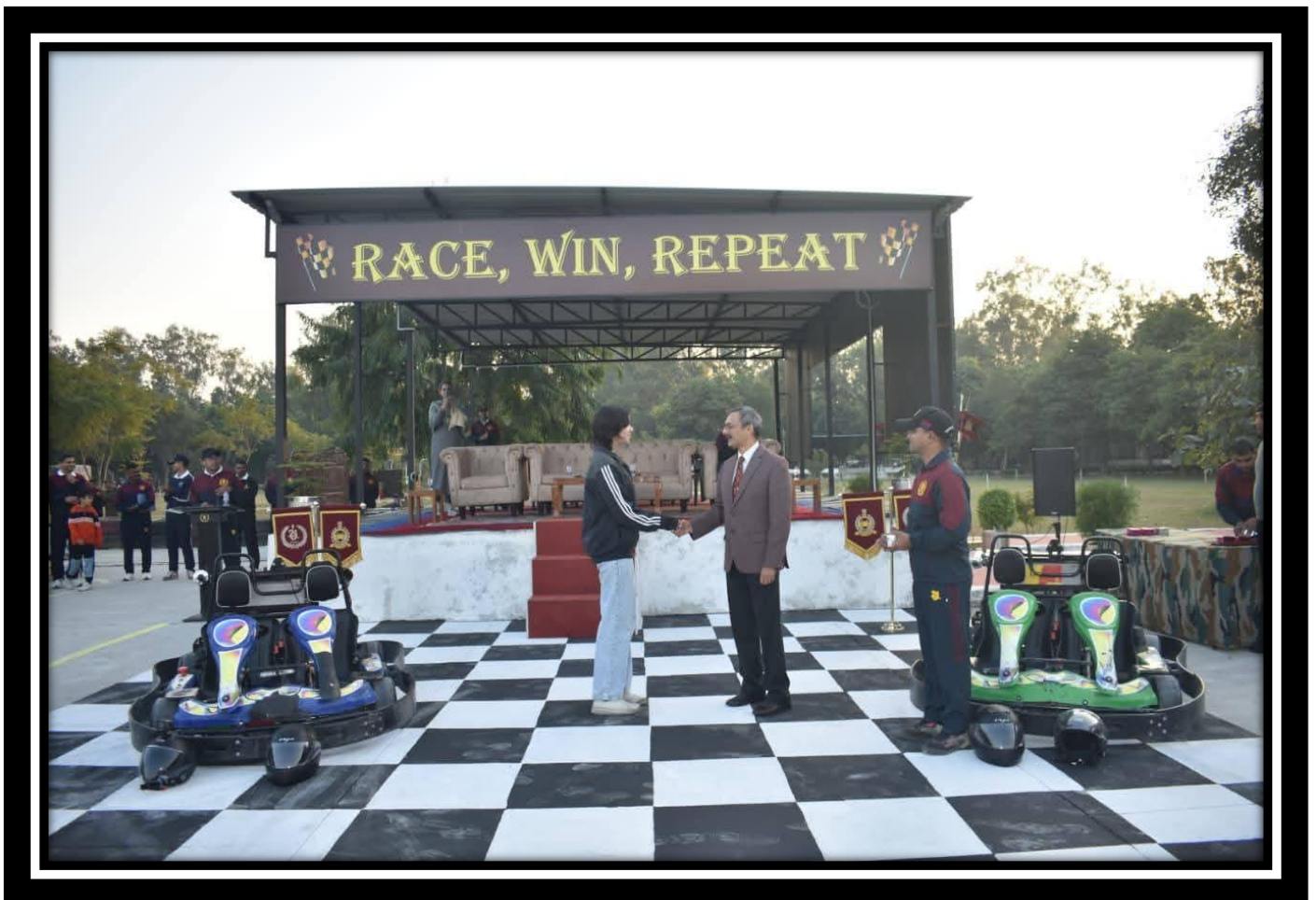
### STUDENT EXCELS IN GO-KARTING COMPETITION

### SHAHIDI OF CHAAR SAHIBZAADE

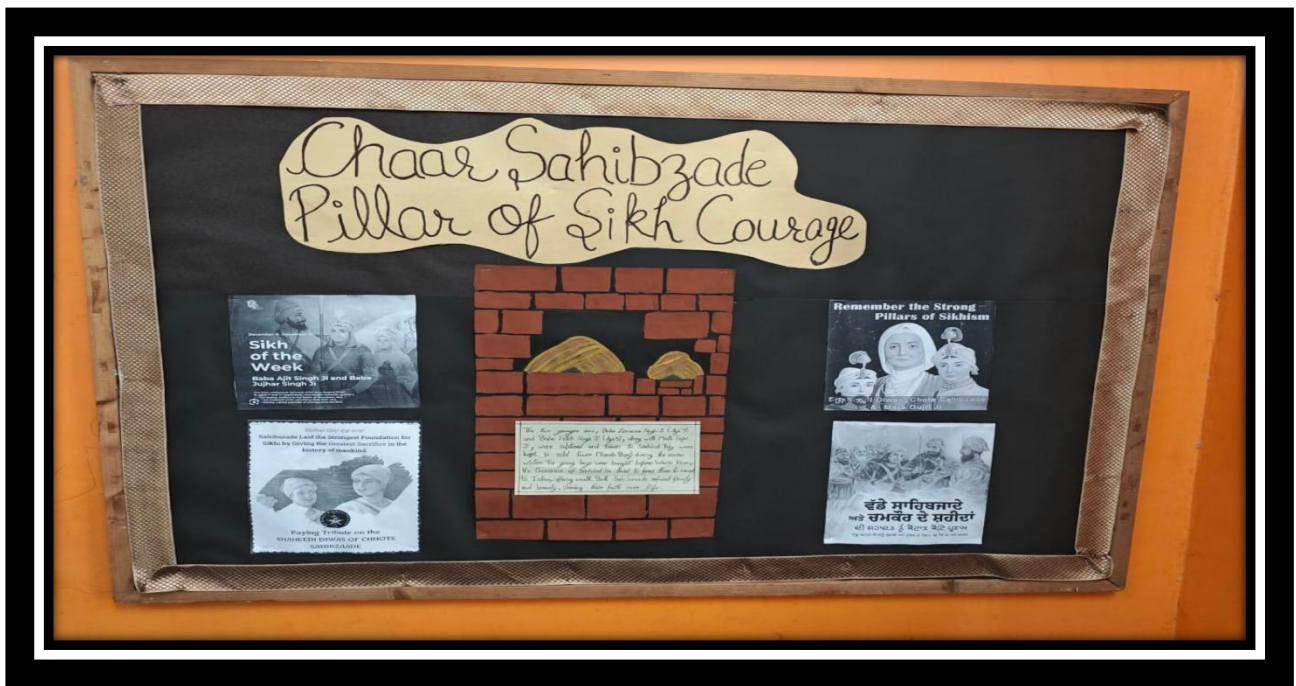
(22<sup>nd</sup> December, 2025)

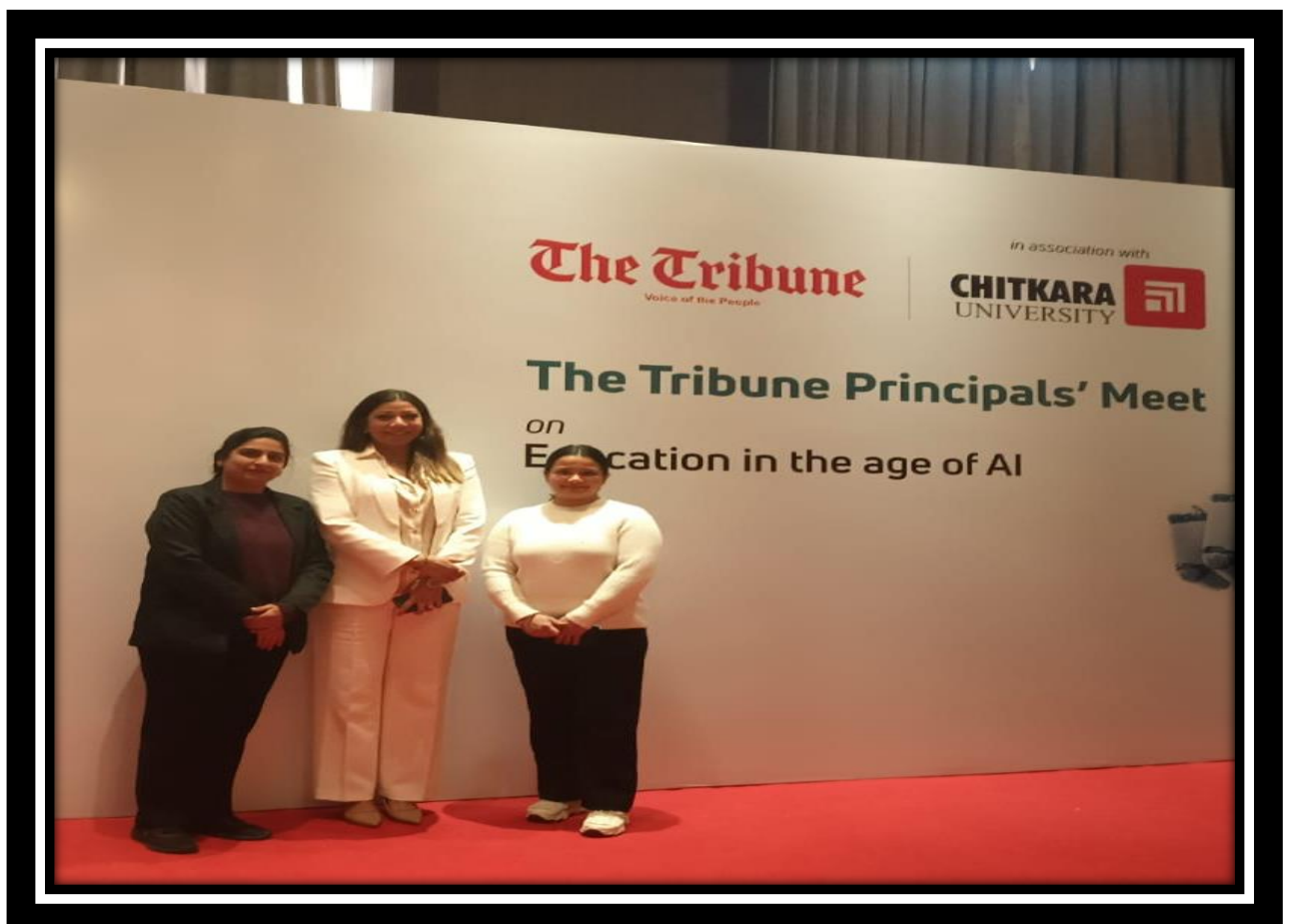
### EDUCATION IN THE AGE OF AI

The session focused on the evolving role of Artificial Intelligence in education and career planning. **Mr. Aadi Garg, Psychology Career Counselor**, shared valuable insights on emerging educational trends and highlighted practical AI-based applications that can enhance teaching and learning processes. **Ms. Preeti Choudhary from Chitkara University** provided detailed information about academic programs and future career opportunities, offering clarity on higher education pathways.

The active participation of our educators reflects the visionary leadership of **the Principal, Dr. Harleen Kaur**, and aligns with the school’s commitment to equipping teachers with advanced competencies for innovative and future-ready education. # Educators are spine of academic system, says expert

Principals' Meet brings teachers together to discuss AI's role in learning

Artificial Intelligence (AI) and its growing influence on education took centre stage at the annual edition of the Principals' Meet, organised by The Tribune in association with Chitkara University on Friday. The event witnessed participation from principals and teachers of prominent schools, who shared their insights on how AI is reshaping teaching and learning.

Renowned psychologist and career counsellor Aadi Garg delivered an eye-opening keynote address, emphasising that the future lies not in AI versus humans, but in AI with humans. "AI is not here to replace teachers. It is here to reduce the burden," he said, adding that the real question is not whether AI will affect education, but whether education is ready for AI.

Highlighting the changing learning patterns of students, Garg noted that today's learners, they grasp faster, get bored easily and often prefer learning through platforms like YouTube rather than traditional textbooks. "The biggest challenge is teacher readiness."

"Educators are the spine of the education system," he remarked. Quoting Bill Gates, Garg said, "When Microsoft was founded, Gates acknowledged that technology is just a tool and educators will always remain above it." He further added, "Technology may open the doors, but no one can replace teachers."

Kiranjith Dhillon from Cambridge Innovative School described the topic as highly relevant, stating, "AI is

already here. It is an enabler and will not replace teachers. Government initiatives, including the introduction of AI and entrepreneurship in Classes 11 and 12, will greatly benefit students in shaping their careers."

Echoing similar sentiments, Shalvi Sehgal from Imvexent Heart's School said technology cannot be ignored and stressed the need to bal-

ance IQ, EQ and SQ with technological advancement. "Teachers have already proven their adaptability during the Covid-19 pandemic," she added.

Sanjukta Majumdar from Doon Public School, Mukerian pointed out that AI is a tool whose effectiveness depends on how well it is blended with human capabilities. She also raised concerns

about AI's environmental impact, noting that high energy consumption and e-waste contribute significantly to carbon emissions. "While we adapt to AI, we must also integrate environmental sustainability into AI education and motivate students to develop energy-efficient models," she said.

Ritu Chawla from St Soldier Elite School highlighted that

technology has both positive and negative aspects, and its impact depends on responsible usage. Ugratosh Yadav from KV2 Jalandhar Cantt compared AI to social media, calling it a powerful tool that should be used to enhance knowledge. Mamta Bahl from Sethi Hukam Chand School cautioned against over-dependence on AI, stressing that students must

continue to use their own critical thinking and creativity.

Sharing her experience, Radhika Gambhir from St Joseph's Convent School said the seminar was informative and well-structured, offering insights into both AI and Chitkara University. Parvesh Kumar from La Bitesom School said the session enhanced his understanding of the NISHTHA programme

and clarified several AI-related concepts. Sandeep Verma from Army Public School termed AI as a revolution which can help students better understand things. The meet concluded with a consensus that while AI is inevitable in education, success depends on informed educators, responsible usage and a balanced integration with human values.
